Fall has always been my favorite season of the year. I love the crisp cool air, the beauty of the fall foliage, and anything made with pumpkins or apples. I love the excitement of a new school year and welcoming folks back to church after summer vacations. I love pulling out favorite sweaters (and maybe even knitting a new one). Then one year, I discovered that I was struggling to enjoy fall, because I knew that meant winter was just around the corner (and I'm much less fond of that season). I love Christmas, and the first snowfall as much as anyone, but I'm not as excited about slippery walkways, heavy coats, and losing one glove again. I miss eating supper out on our deck and having several hours of daylight after we get home from work. That year, and every year since, I have to remind myself to not let apprehension about the winter take away my joy in today.

This year, I've worked on applying this lesson to other areas in my life. As it has been for a number of you, this year has been a challenging one for our family. At times, it has been a struggle to not worry about what might be coming next, and to let that rob me of my joy today.

What is trying to take away your joy these days? Are you anxious about something in the season ahead? Is fear of

making ends meet in the future robbing you of the joy retirement should bring? Are fears about future health problems giving you heart burn today? Is worrying about finding a new pastor making it hard to enjoy this interim season in the life our church?

If so, I invite you to join me in praying two sets of Scripture verses. The first is Philippians 4:6-7: *Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.* The second is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: *Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks, for this is God's will in Christ Jesus.*

These verses don't change our circumstances, but they will help us to pause and regain perspective. Even when the darkness falls early, there is beauty blazing all around us. May God grant us all peace as we seek to make ourselves present in it. Need a little extra help? 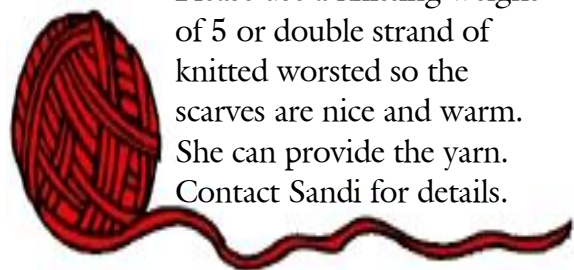
