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## GIVE PRAISE TO GOD

### Lighting the Advent Wreath

#### Scripture

Isaiah 35:1-2, 4-7a, 8-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus <sup>2</sup> it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.

<sup>4</sup> Say to those who are of a fearful heart, “Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you.” <sup>5</sup> Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; <sup>6</sup> then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; <sup>7</sup> the burning sand shall become a pool.

<sup>8</sup> A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God’s people; no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray. <sup>9</sup> No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. <sup>10</sup> And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

## Meditation

This is the first word of Isaiah's vision for the people of Israel. In this vision of the future when God redeems God's people again, the wilderness sings! Where there has been barrenness there are blooms, where there has been mere dust, there is flowing water. Those who have been weak and infirmed are now strong and whole. God's arrival transforms every inability into ability and every lack into miraculous abundance. And in response there is great joy.

And that is not all. There is one more miracle -- the road home. In this place that was once a wilderness, there is now a raised road. On it there is no danger, no wandering, everyone who finds it shall know the way. As the people walk on this road, there is singing and joy and great gladness.

Today's candle is lit for all of us who know loneliness, who live with limitations or disabilities, and who long in some way for a better life. The candle of joy is our affirmation of God's promise of redemption – real redemption, someday in our experience, when all that causes us sadness or worry or despair, is miraculously redeemed. God comes. God is here. And together, in this life and the next, we sing for joy as we walk together on the road home.

## The Candle of Joy

**One:** We light the candle of Joy, affirming our belief that in whatever wilderness we experience, God redeems. We sing and worship in gratitude for the promise made flesh in Jesus and the promise in the future we will someday know.

**All:** In this season of Advent, we claim the Joy of Jesus and wait for God's full redemption of the creation and ourselves.
