Ecclesiastes 1:1-4, 17, 18; 2:24-25;
3:1-8, 14; 9:7 (adapted from *GNT*)

It is useless, useless, said the Philosopher. Life is useless, all useless. You spend your life working, laboring, and what do you have to show for it? Generations come and generations go, but the world stays just the same.

I was determined to learn the difference between knowledge and foolishness, wisdom and madness. But I found out that I might as well be chasing the wind. The wiser you are the more worries you have; the more you know, the more it hurts. The best thing we can do is eat and drink and enjoy what we have earned.
